Construction season is almost here! In 2023 a couple changes were implemented that affect how residential and commercial driveways and sidewalks are to be constructed within the City right-of-way. This letter is being provided to notify you of those changes and also to provide a reminder about existing policies and procedures.

The Engineering Department has recently observed a number of driveway approach panels that are failing due to premature cracking. To address this issue, the 2023 City standards were adjusted to require additional reinforcing of driveway approaches. This entails that rebar be included in all driveway approach apron concrete. Flares are to be thickened and granular base course under driveway approach panels shall be tapered to the full base course thickness at the curb. Attached with this letter is a summary of driveway and sidewalk specifications and City Standard Drawings 64.02 and 64.03, which depict these changes.

As in previous years, prior to beginning work be sure to first obtain a City permit when one is required. All sidewalks, whether new or being replaced, and all new driveway approaches require a City permit. If replacing an existing driveway approach a permit is required if any curb is to be cut, if the dimensions of the driveway approach are being altered, or if part of the sidewalk is being replaced to construct the driveway approach. These permits may be obtained at the Building Inspections Department in City Hall.

City staff shall be contacted to ensure proper layout and that specifications and standards are being met. Three (3) days prior to beginning sidewalk construction, contact the City Engineering Surveyor at (701)740-6758. The surveyor will provide you with proper line and grade for the sidewalk. Make sure that your site is clean and accessible prior to contacting the surveyor. For all sidewalk and driveway approach construction, the City Engineering Inspector shall also be contacted at (701)740-6736. The inspector will need to be notified of your intentions for the placement of the concrete a minimum of 24 hours in advance so they can check the forms, ensure required rebar is in place and plan to inspect the placement of the concrete. Any sidewalk or driveway approaches found within the right-of-way to be out of compliance with City standards may be deemed unacceptable and be required to be removed and replaced.

Thank you for adhering to these procedures. Your attention to detail and cooperation enables us all to provide quality infrastructure to the residents and businesses in Grand Forks!
